

WE FIND INSPIRATION IN OUR NATION'S HISTORY:

This weekend, Roll Back Tolls takes inspiration from our nation's history and we'd like to share a page with you...

On December 16, 1773, three tea ships arrived in Boston Harbor. At midnight, sixty members of the Sons of Liberty, working with Samuel Adams, dumped \$18,000 of tea in Boston Harbor in answer to Great Britain's Tea Act of 1773. Taxes were weighing heavily upon the colonists, who tired of unjustified levies upon their livelihood by those who did not fairly represent them.



In response to this act of rebellion, the British Parliament enacted the Coercive Act of 1774 and closed Boston off from the shipping industry by denying them access to their harbor and waterways.
